### Nativity's Vestry Begins Nativity 2020 Planning Process

As Nativity enters its tenth year, the vestry has begun a planning process to chart our way through the next four to five years. The planning process builds on the work our "Raising the Roof" team began last year: studying community demographics, interviewing leaders in the community, interviewing Nativity members, and discerning Nativity's special gifts that it can offer to our neighborhood. Now, we are working on the five major goals Pastor Susan set at the 2016 Annual Meeting. We have formed a planning committee around each of these goals. The five teams and leaders are:

Build Discipleship Practices and Become an Evangelizing Community. Team Leader: Jeff Jameson; Vestry Liaison: Art Graf. This group will work on building practices of prayer, worship, service, and learning in our congregation, and taking the good news of Christ to others.

Create a Marketing Plan to Reach the Community. Team Leader: Fred Walski; Vestry Liaison: Bill Deihl. This group will work on marketing, public relations, and communications strategies to get our message out.

Develop Strong, Spiritual Gifts-Based Lay Leadership. Team Leader: Suzanne Cohen; Vestry Liaison: Jennie Dobbins. This group will work on helping members discern their gifts and put them to use, and supporting lay leaders in their ministries.

Achieve Financial Sustainability. Team Leader: Mark Dobbins; Vestry Liaison: David Bolger. This team will work on helping Nativity as it matures work toward financial stability and long-term financial planning, including operating sustainability, planned giving, and capital expansion plans.

Open the After-School Program. Team Leader: Cindy Cohen; Vestry Liaison: Jen Goins. This program will not be able to open this fall as we hoped due to City of Scottsdale delays in granting a permit to build the playground. Still, we plan to move forward with the project, with a planned opening date of Summer 2017.

Pentecost is often referred to as “the birthday of the church.” This is not entirely correct, because to be honest, the church began on that Easter morning when

Christ was raised from the dead, and our salvation was complete.

Yet, this year, Pentecost falls on May 15, and in a very real sense it is a birthday for Church of the Nativity. Almost exactly ten years ago on this date, a group of hardy pioneers met at the home of Alastair and Mary Longley-Cook to begin dreaming and visioning about what the new Episcopal church in the North Scottsdale/Desert Ridge area would look like.

I was there as the newly called church planter, hired by the bishop, and 13 other folks were there, including the Longley-Cooks, the Dobbins, the Worthingtons, Debbie Myrick, Elizabeth Barrett and Bob Welch, and others. From that small beginning grew the wonderful church we call home.

We began our visioning that summer of 2006 by asking three questions: Who are we and what do we have to offer? Who are the people in our community and what are their needs and wants? And what is God’s mission in this place? From those three questions, we began to discern what God was calling us to do, and later that year, we began worshiping in Grayhawk Elementary School.

This year, we begin our celebration of this first ten years with our kickoff celebration on May 15. We go to our summer service schedule that day: services at 8:30 and 10:00 a.m. After the 10:00 service, we have our Men’s Chili Cookoff, birthday cake, and Hymn Festival. During the service, we will recognize our Sunday school teachers and students, our musicians, and other folks who have contributed so much to our church. It’s a big day to celebrate a wonderful church! And it’s the beginning of our next few months of celebrations. Don’t miss it!

## Nativity’s Summer Schedule Begins May 15

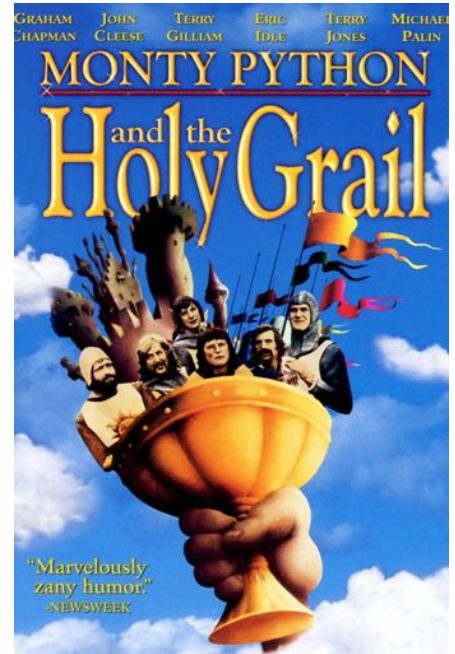

There's a scene in "Life of Brian" where Brian is trying to get away from a hoard of pursuers wanting to hear more of his wise sayings. He finds a gourd in his hand after fighting through some merchants and then subsequently drops it. Some of the pursuing band of people pick up the gourd and immediately proclaim it the Royal Gourd of the Messiah. This scene points to some of the religious fascination the faithful have demonstrated in the past for relics of Christian antiquity. One relic that is entirely legend with not one wit of truth is that of the Holy Grail. The tale of the Grail was spun out of some vague passages in the apocryphal

Gospel of Nicodemus, which tells a story of an unjustly imprisoned Joseph of Arimethea shortly after the resurrection being "fed" by the Lord Jesus Christ. From there the legend grew that the item from which he was fed was an item from the Last Supper. The legend also tells of Joseph's migration to the British isles and thus you have the seed of a story that would find this "Holy Grail" lost somewhere in the British Isles. When this gets wrapped up in the King Arthur legends and the Knights of the Round Table you have a situation ripe for parody. "Monty Python and the Holy Grail," the Big Fun Bible Movie for May is a most hardy parody of this extra-canonical legend. Friday, May 6 at 6:30 is the show date and time. For May they prepared Tchaikovsky's "Glory Be to Thee, Thou All in All" and Moses Hogan's "Ev're Time I Feel the Spirit". The latter will be joined by children on the Pentecost day. One of our choir members Brenda Russell-Basso wrote an original composition "Take Time" and we will present it to you also on May 15th.

Our fabulous lead singers Marcy McKee and Michael Frongillo will dive into the complex repertoire of Bach, and will perform Duetto "Ein unbegreiflich Licht" (Incomprehensible Light) from Cantata Mit Fried und Freud ich fahr dahin, BWV 125 on Mother's Day.

We will be performing approximately 200 hours of service in this town along side of four other youth groups from Wisconsin, Utah, Colorado and Texas. We will also be spending time in worship, study, reflection and I'm sure some pretty heavy giggling.
