THE 2019 ANNUAL MEETING RECAP

The 2019 Annual Meeting of the Episcopal Church of the Nativity was held in the church

immediately after the 10 am service on January 26, 2020. About 109 people attended.

During the sermon time that day, I gave the "Rector's Report," sometimes known as a "State of the Church Address." The Rector's Report can be found in the Annual Meeting Report booklet. You can also find the reports of the Associate Rector, Deacon, Music Director, and Youth, Children and Families Minister. The 2019 Financials and 2020 Mission and Ministry Budget is also in the booklet. Copies of that report may be found on the table outside the church office in Christopher Hall. You also may pick up a new Parish Phone Directory on the same table.

During the Annual Meeting I officially appointed Paul Rank as our new Senior Warden, often known as the "Rector's Warden." Also, the parish elected new vestry members, including a new Junior Warden, Ron Kupinski. The Junior Warden, often known as the "People's Warden," is the point person for the building and grounds of the church. Both Wardens serve a one-year term with the option to be reappointed or reelected for up to three terms.

We had a great slate of candidates for the vestry. For the three-year term the following were elected: Dennis Long, Mary Longley-Cook and Dina Horsman. For the one-year term the following were elected: Diana Fitzgerald and James Newhouse.

The parish elected the following five delegates to the Annual Diocesan Convention (held in mid-October): Cindy Cohen, Jennie Dobbins, Mark Dobbins, Cheryle Dunkelberg and Jan Dunkelberg. The following five were elected as alternate delegates: Shelley Carley, Candy Wagner, Donna Hartz, Debbie Myrick and Janyce Schneider.

Please thank all the candidates who ran for vestry and delegates. I would like to thank retiring Senior Warden Suzanne Cohen and Junior Warden Warren Sambach for their devotion and service to Nativity and the countless hours they gave to keep the church viable during the interim period.

I also appointed Dawn Kast as Parish Historian, Tom Durham as Parish Chancellor, Cindy Cohen as Outreach Chair, and Jon Coates as Finance Chair. I am deeply grateful for their willingness to serve. Please thank them.

After the Annual Meeting, the new vestry had a short meeting in order to elect a Treasurer and a Clerk. Art Graf was elected Treasurer and Cheryle Dunkelberg was elected Clerk of the Vestry. Please thank them also for their service.

Finally, please know that vestry meetings are open meetings and are held the third Thursdays of the month at 6 pm. All are welcome to attend.

Wayne's World

Gentile women just don't get their names as titles of books in the Bible, except for Ruth. Matthew even mentions Ruth in the genealogy of Jesus. The book that bears her name is a refreshing interruption of

Israel's rocky narrative in the Old Testament. Ruth's story is set in the time of the Judges, which is why it canonically follows the book by that name. The book of Ruth tells the story of a woman from Moab who would become the great-grandmother of King David. It precedes the books of Samuel that include the entirety of David's biblical saga.

Ruth's tale is an inclusive one that emphasizes how the people of God are never any ethnic group. It is a reminder of how God's purposes win out even when human ideas of racial purity do not. Ruth's story demonstrates how exclusivist ideals are, in the end, petty human constructions that only thwart the activity of a sovereign Creator God.

This brief but powerful book, only 4 chapters long, is the topic of Bible Study Wednesday beginning February 5. Join Dr. Wayne in this exploration of the scriptures at 6:30 pm. Every class closes with the prayers of Compline by 7:30.

The Enhancement Committee is dedicated to honoring the wishes of donors, when practicable, for special gifts made to The Episcopal Church of the Nativity, particularly those made in memory of a loved one.

Memorials and Gifts Policies, Procedures, and Protocols

Memorials and Gifts are always welcome and are a vital part of the life and history of The Episcopal Church of the Nativity. The Enhancement Committee consists of the Rector, Junior Warden, the lay Chairperson, and others asked to serve from time to time, including representation from other committees determined to be appropriate to the project or issue involved.

The Enhancement Committee recognizes and accepts the need for responsible stewardship of donated gifts in an open and sensitive manner. As such, the committee is committed to aligning all gifts with the mission and policies of the Episcopal Church of the Nativity.

In accordance with the Bylaws of the Episcopal Church of the Nativity all gifts of any type must be accepted by the Vestry. The Enhance Committee serves as an advisory committee to the Vestry. The committee's recommendations are not binding on the Vestry.

When a gift of property, tangible goods, (e.g. equipment, decorations, artwork, etc.) or cash is offered, its acceptance is subject to the review and consideration of the committee. In all cases, the Rector reserves the right to veto any decision by the committee. Non-memorialized monetary gifts are <u>not</u> subject to review or consideration by this committee. Rather, such gifts are to be accepted and used at the discretion of the Vestry.

All restricted gifts must be accompanied by written instructions provided by the donor (negotiated and edited if necessary) detailing the prescribed use(s) of the gift. *Appraisal of a donated item is solely the responsibility of the donor and not subject to the committee's authority.*

Both the Enhancement Committee and the Rector (Senior Warden in absence of the Rector) must agree to restrictions placed upon such gifts prior to acceptance. As previously stated, final acceptance or refusal of any gift is the responsibility of the Vestry. A copy of the donor directive and corresponding documentation will be held in the church office. Any gift, memorial or otherwise that does not prescribe an intended use of the gifted funds will be considered an unrestricted gift. Gifts given "in lieu of flowers" will be considered unrestricted unless otherwise specified by the family.

Gifts should meet the practical needs of the parish, be of high quality, and require minimum upkeep. Funds for upkeep and maintenance may be provided by the donor as part of the gift. The gift should be compatible with the Episcopal tradition, be suited for liturgical or other intended use, be appropriate to the architecture of the church, and harmonize with the existing spaces and accretions. If the committee has concerns about a proposed gift, efforts will be made to suggest a more appropriate gift.

The committee will periodically publish a list of prioritized needs of the parish for consideration by potential donors. Once accepted, no gift may be returned in any way to the donor or a designee. The parish cannot guarantee the perpetual use of any gift.

Upon request the Committee chair will provide an annual report to the Rector for inclusion in the Parish Annual Report.

We celebrate Black History month as we did last year, tracing the traditional Spiritual and its influence on the contemporary gospel style. The Spiritual was once a statement of sadness, despair and longing, but also became a secret code for slaves to communicate plans to escape to the north. Some recent controversy over whether or not we should continue singing these soulful tunes has been on the table, stating that we shouldn't remind ourselves of times when our nation was so dark and injustice so blatantly tolerated. My answer is two-fold: first, give credit to where credit is due--our entire contemporary pop, worship and gospel styles are derived from those spirituals. The story of those courageous individuals who sought and fought for freedom lives on in most churches throughout the world in some form. Secondly, what present day gospel has turned into (Kirk Franklin, Israel Houghton, Smokie Norful) is some of the most joy-filled music that exists, with narratives of happiness, forgiveness and healing. We should acknowledge where that music comes from and notice that often true joy can be found in the face of deep sorrow. It's a beautiful phenomenon to embrace and be inspired by

Nativity Film Club








Habitat for Humanity

Planned Giving



What Is Planned Giving?

Planned giving encompasses a variety of ways that gifts can be made to the church from accumulated resources.

It usually involves financial or estate planning; however, it is not reserved for the wealthy. Planned giving is a means by which anyone concerned with the wise use of his or her personal resources makes a considered choice about their ultimate disposition.

In general planned gifts are made through:

Bequest in a Will

Planning for the End of Life

Life Income Gift such as a pooled income fund, a charitable gift annuity, or a charitable remainder trust

- Pooled Income Fund
- Charitable Gift Annuity
- Charitable Remainder Trust

Gifts of Special Assets (real estate, closely held stock, life insurance, retirement accounts)

Planned giving establishes a way for a donor to provide for family members while remembering the church as well. It often enables the donor to provide more for his or her heirs and to make a larger gift than thought possible. It often reduces taxes as well.

Planned gifts can be designated for an organization's general funds or its endowment. Planned gifts are either outright gifts (i.e., gifts of appreciated securities, real property, personal property, etc.) or deferred gifts (i.e. bequests, charitable gift annuities, charitable trusts).

Snowbirds may want consider gifting to their home church and The Episcopal Church of the Nativity to help sustain both churches. Please contact me if you have any questions about giving to the Legacy Society.
